11 Amend the bill in section 1 in paragraph G in subparagraph (6) in the first line (page
12 1, line 23 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "2006, and" and inserting in its place the
13 following: '2006 are elected to the Legislature and.'

14 Further amend the bill in section 2 in paragraph F in the first line (page 1, line 26 in
15 L.D.) by inserting after the following: "subparagraph (6)," the following: 'have been
16 elected to the Legislature after July 1, 2006 and'

17 SUMMARY

18 This amendment, which is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on
19 Labor, provides the health coverage benefit of the bill only to those Legislators elected
20 after July 1, 2006.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill would not affect State retirement costs for the current biennium. It is not known exactly how many individuals would ultimately take advantage of this change but at the current retirement health insurance premium rate for individuals each retired individual participating could ultimately cost the State Employee Health Plan \$585 dollar per month or approximately \$7,000 per year.
