- 2. Terms. Each member of the council serves for a term of 3 years or until the member's successor is appointed. If a member is unable to complete the term, the appointing authority shall appoint a person to serve out the remainder of the unexpired term. Except for members appointed under subsection 1, paragraph A, a member may not serve for more than 2 consecutive terms.'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in §216 by renumbering subsections 4 to 12 to read consecutively.

Further amend the bill in section 6 in the 4th line (page 5, line 20 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "paragraph E" and inserting in its place the following: 'paragraph B' and in the 6th line (page 5, line 22 in L.D.) by striking out the following "paragraph F" and inserting in its place the following: 'paragraph C'

Further amend the bill in section 7 in the 3rd line (page 5, line 28 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "subsection 7" and inserting in its place the following: 'subsection 6'

Further amend the bill in section 8 in the 3rd line (page 6, line 26 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "subsection 7" and inserting in its place the following: 'subsection 6'

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 8 the following:

- 'Sec. 9. Legislative members to serve on Maine Food Policy Council. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 7, section 216, subsection 1, the Maine Food Policy Council at the time of its inception and for one year from that date consists of 15 members, 11 members appointed in accordance with Title 7, section 216, subsection 1 and 4 legislative members appointed as follows:
- 1. Two members serving on the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agricultural matters at the time of their appointment; one appointed by the President of the Senate and one appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- 2. One member serving on the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over matters pertaining to marine fisheries at the time of appointment and appointed by the President of the Senate; and

3. One member serving on the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over matters of health and nutrition at the time of appointment and appointed by the Speaker of the House.'
