
SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 861, L.D. 2115, Bill, "An Act To Amend the Boundaries between the City of Saco and the Town of Old Orchard Beach"

Amend the bill by inserting after the title the following:

Mandate preamble. This measure requires one or more local units of government to expand or modify activities so as to necessitate additional expenditures from local revenues but does not provide funding for at least 90% of those expenditures. Pursuant to the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 21, 2/3 of all of the members elected to each House have determined it necessary to enact this measure.'

New or Expanded Activity

Requiring a change to the boundary line between Old Orchard Beach and Saco will necessitate revision of town maps and a new survey. This requirement represents a mandate pursuant to the Maine Constitution. The costs are not expected to be significant. Pursuant to the Mandate Preamble, the two-thirds vote of all the members elected to each House exempts the State from the constitutional requirement to fund 90% of the additional local costs.
