2 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §4011-A, sub-§1, ¶A, as repealed and replaced by PL 2003, c. 3 599, §8 and affected by §§9 and 14, is amended to read: 4 A. When acting in a professional capacity: 5 (1) An allopathic or osteopathic physician, resident or intern; 6 (2) An emergency medical services person; 7 (3) A medical examiner; 8 (4) A physician's assistant; 9 (5) A dentist; 10 (6) A dental hygienist; 11 (7) A dental assistant; 12 (8) A chiropractor; 13 (9) A podiatrist; 14 (10) A registered or licensed practical nurse; 15 (11) A teacher; 16 (12) A guidance counselor; 17 (13) A school official; (14) A children's summer camp administrator or counselor; 18 19 (15) A social worker; 20 (16) A court-appointed special advocate or guardian ad litem for the child; 21 (17) A homemaker; 22 (18) A home health aide: 23 (19) A medical or social service worker; 24 (20) A psychologist; 25 (21) Child care personnel; 26 (22) A mental health professional; 27 (23) A law enforcement official; 28 (24) A state or municipal fire inspector; 29 (25) A municipal code enforcement official; (26) A commercial film and photographic print processor; 30 A clergy member acquiring the information as a result of clerical 31 32 professional work except for information received during confidential 33 communications;

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

1 2	(28) A chair of a professional licensing board that has jurisdiction over mandated reporters; and
3 4	(29) A humane agent employed by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources; and
5	(30) A provider of abortion services when that provider knows or has reasonable
6	cause to suspect that a child under 16 years of age has been sexually abused by a
7	family member. When a report is made under this subparagraph, the department
8	shall keep confidential that the child had sought abortion services.
9	SUMMARY
0	This bill makes providers of abortion services mandatory reporters of child sex abuse
1	with regard to a child under 16 years of age when the provider knows or has reasonable
2	cause to suspect that the child has been sexually abused by a family member. The bill
3	makes confidential the information that the child had sought abortion services.
