17 18 19 20	1. Distracted driving. A person may not operate a motor vehicle while distracted. For purposes of this section, "distracted" means engaged in an activity not related to the actual operation of a motor vehicle in a manner that interferes with the safe operation of the vehicle on a public way.		
21 22	2. Violation. A person is guilty of distracted driving if that person operates, with criminal negligence as defined in Title 17-A, section 35, a motor vehicle while distracted.

A violation of this section is a Class E crime that, notwithstanding Title 17-A, section 1301, is punishable by a fine of not less than \$300 for the first offense and a mandatory 30-day suspension of the violator's driver's license for a 2nd offense occurring within 3 years of the first offense.'

28 29 30 31	This amendment, which is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation, replaces the bill. The amendment defines "distracted" and makes it a Class E crime to drive while distracted. The amendment also imposes a fine of \$300 for the first offense of driving while distracted and a suspension of a person's license for 30
