1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 30 MRSA c. 605 is enacted to read:
3	CHAPTER 605
4 5	METIS EASTERN TRIBAL INDIAN SOCIETY OF MAINE RECOGNITION ACT
6	§8101. Short title
7 <b>8</b>	This chapter may be known and cited as "the Metis Eastern Tribal Indian Society o Maine Recognition Act."
9	§8102. Definitions
10	As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
12 13 14	1. Laws of the State. "Laws of the State" means the Constitution of Maine and al laws and rules of the State and its political subdivisions and judicial interpretation thereof.
5	2. Metis. "Metis" means a person who:
16	A. Is of Metis Nation ancestry;
17	B. Self-identifies as Metis; and
8	C. Is a member of the Metis Eastern Tribal Indian Society of Maine.
19 20	3. Metis Eastern Tribal Indian Society of Maine. "Metis Eastern Tribal Indian Society of Maine" means the membership society of Metis people in this State.
21	4. Metis Nation. "Metis Nation" means the people who are:
22 23	A. Included within the definition of "aboriginal peoples of Canada" within section 3: of the Constitution Act, 1982 of Canada; and
24 25 26	B. Descended from the historic aboriginal people then known as Metis who resided in the area of North America known as the historic Metis Nation homeland and used and occupied as the traditional territory of the Metis.
27	§8103. Recognition
28 29	The State recognizes the Metis Eastern Tribal Indian Society of Maine as a distinct aboriginal group.
30	§8104. Laws of the State
31	Nothing in this Act alters the application of the laws of the State to any person of entity or extends to any person or entity a legal status that augments or diminishes the

- person's or entity's rights, powers, privileges or immunities under the laws of the State.
- 2 The Metis Eastern Tribal Indian Society of Maine, Metis people and all property held by
- 3 or for the Metis Eastern Tribal Indian Society of Maine or any Metis person are subject to
- 4 the laws of the State and to the civil and criminal jurisdiction of the courts of the State to
- 5 the same extent as any other person, entity or property.

## 6 SUMMARY

- 7 This bill extends state recognition to the Metis Eastern Tribal Indian Society of
- 8 Maine as a distinct aboriginal group. This bill does not alter the application of the laws of
- 9 the State to the Metis Eastern Tribal Indian Society of Maine or Metis people.
