## An Act To Clarify the Requirements for Temporary Licensure of Psychologists

### 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §3824, sub-§5, as amended by PL 1991, c. 144, §1, is further
amended to read:

4 5. Temporary licensure. The board shall provide rules for the granting of a 5 temporary license to enable psychologists to practice in this State under supervision prior to full licensure by the board. An applicant who possesses at least 1,500 hours of 6 postdoctoral experience and fulfills all the requirements for licensure, except the written 7 examination, may apply to the board for a temporary license. Upon receiving a 8 completed application and fee and upon the applicant's successful completion of an oral 9 examination, the board shall issue a temporary license that entitles the applicant to 10 practice as a psychologist or psychological examiner under supervision while completing 11 the requirements for permanent licensure. The temporary license is effective for one 12 13 year.

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### **SUMMARY**

15 This bill specifies that applicants for temporary licensure by the State Board of 16 Examiners of Psychologists must possess at least 1,500 hours of postdoctoral experience.
