1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and
3 allocations are made.

4 **COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM, BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE MAINE**

5 **Maine Community College System - Board of Trustees 0556**

6 Initiative: Provides one-time funds to Northern Maine Community College to help fund a
7 collaborative allied health center in partnership with the University of Maine at Presque
8 Isle, the State and local health care providers. This funding is to be used primarily to
9 purchase equipment for the center.

16 This bill makes a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$500,000 in fiscal year

20 center.
