1 Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 3 Whereas, women from Maine who have served in the Armed Services of the United 4 States have made countless contributions and tremendous sacrifices during times of war; 5 and 6 Whereas, it is important to recognize the contribution of Maine women veterans and 7 educate the people of Maine concerning the role of women during wartime since this Nation was founded: and 8 9 Whereas, the Commission to Arrange for a Monument Honoring Women Veterans of Maine has recommended and received initial approval for a patriotic, educational and 10 inspiring monument to be erected near the Capitol; and 11 12 Whereas, a major fund-raising effort needs to begin in order for this monument to be available for all of the people of Maine and visitors to this State as provided in the 13 timeline provided in the report of the Commission to Arrange for a Monument Honoring 14 Women Veterans of Maine; and 15 16 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 17 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, now, 18 therefore, be it 19 20 Sec. 1. Bureau of General Services to transfer funds for construction of a monument honoring women veterans of Maine. Resolved: That the Director of 21 the Bureau of General Services within the Department of Administrative and Financial 22 Services is directed to transfer \$250,000 to the account established to accept donations for 23 the Women Veterans Monument as recommended by the Commission to Arrange for a 24 25 Monument Honoring Women Veterans of Maine; and be it further Sec. 2. Appropriations and allocations. Resolved: That the following 26 27 appropriations and allocations are made. ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL SERVICES, DEPARTMENT OF 28 29 **Bureau of General Services** Initiative: To provide initial funding for the construction of a monument to honor women 30 veterans of Maine. 31 32 33
