SUMMARY

This amendment specifies that the new Class B crime of operating a motor vehicle while under the influence 6 or more times is limited by a 15-year lookback period, which is 5 years more than the current lookback period for operating under the influence offenses but less than the lifetime lookback proposed in the bill.

Current biennium cost increase - General Fund

Correctional and Judicial Impact Statements

Increases the class of crime for OUI to class B for person with 5 previous convictions; increases correctional and judicial costs. Sentences of more than nine months imposed for a Class B crime must be served in a state correctional facility. The average cost to the state for each sentence is \$98,327 based on an average length of stay of 2 years 7 months. Sentences of nine months or less imposed for a Class B crime must be served in a county jail. The average cost to a county for each sentence is \$26,677 based on an average length of stay of 8 months and 12 days.
