- 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §682, sub-§2-A, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 447, §22, is
 amended to read:
- 4 2-A. Application. This subsection governs the application of subsection subsections
 5 2 and 4-A.

6 A. <u>Subsection Subsections 2 does and 4-A do not apply to pollwatchers</u>, who may 7 remain in the voting place outside the guardrail enclosure as long as they do not 8 attempt to influence voters or interfere with their free passage.

9 B. Subsection 2 does not prohibit media representatives from conducting an exit 10 poll, as long as they do not solicit voters until after the voters have voted and do not 11 orally communicate with voters in a way that influences a voter's vote.

- 12 C. If a person attempts to influence voters or interfere with their free passage, the 13 warden shall have that person removed from the voting place.
- 14 Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §682, sub-§4-A is enacted to read:

15 <u>4-A. Limitation on number of political campaign workers.</u> Only a candidate or
 16 <u>one representative from that candidate's political campaign may be present at an entrance</u>
 17 to a voting place.

SUMMARY

19 This bill limits the number of campaign workers allowed at an entrance to a voting 20 place to only the candidate or one representative from the campaign.
