COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 105, L.D. 322, "Resolve, To Ensure More Comprehensive Investigation and Prosecution of Computer Crimes"

Amend the resolve in section 1 in the 2nd line (page 1, line 16 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "That" the following: 'during the First Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature'

Amend the resolve in section 1 by inserting at the end after the following: "recommendations." the following: 'The review and any proposed legislation must be completed by June 15, 2007.'

**SUMMARY**

This amendment clarifies that the review and assessment of the computer crimes unit of the Department of Public Safety be completed by the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety during the First Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature. The committee will not meet during the interim to do this work.

### Legislative Study

This legislation clarifies that the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety will conduct its review of the computer crimes unit during the First Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature and any proposed legislation must be completed by June 15, 2007. It is anticipated that any minor costs associated with this review will be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
