COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 116, L.D. 372, Bill, "An Act To Strengthen the Crime of Gross Sexual Assault as It Pertains to Persons Who Furnish Drugs to Victims"

Amend the bill in section 1 in paragraph A in the 2nd line (page 1, line 5 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "furnishing," the following: 'as defined in section 1101, subsection 18, paragraph A.'

### Fiscal Note

### Correctional and Judicial Impact Statements

Establishes new Class B crimes; increases correctional and judicial costs. Sentences of more than nine months must be served in state correctional facilities. The average cost to the state for each sentence is \$98,327 based on an average length of stay of 2 years 7 months. Sentences of nine months or less imposed for a Class B crime must be served in county jails. The average cost to a county for each sentence is \$26,677 based on an average length of stay of 8 months and 12 days. The collection of additional fines may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.
