### **An Act To Allow the District Court To Adjudicate Parentage in Child Protective Custody Cases**

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §4005-F** is enacted to read:

3 **§4005-F. Determinations of parentage**

4 As part of a child protection proceeding, the District Court may determine parentage  
5 of the child. Title 19-A, sections 1558 to 1564 apply to determinations of parentage in a  
6 child protection proceeding.

7 A determination pursuant to this section that a person is or is not a child's father  
8 operates as a determination of parentage for all purposes inside and outside of the child  
9 protection proceedings, including but not limited to proceedings pursuant to Title 19-A,  
10 chapters 51 to 69.

11 This section may not be construed to limit the right of a person to file an action  
12 pursuant to Title 19-A, chapter 53, subchapter 1 to enforce a father's obligations pursuant  
13 to that subchapter.

14 **SUMMARY**

15 This bill gives the District Court the authority to determine parentage as part of a  
16 child protection proceeding, and that determination is controlling in all subsequent  
17 proceedings, including those established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 19-A  
18 dealing with child custody, child support and similar actions.
