22	SUMMARY
23	This bill provides that an amount of money equal to the amount spent on independen

24 expenditures in support of the election of a participating candidate in the Maine Clean
25 Election Act by a political action committee of which the participating candidate is a
26 principal officer, primary fundraiser or decision maker must be paid to the Maine Clean
27 Election Fund.
