1 within the department for the deposit of any fees collected for the certification, 2 authorization and approval of educational personnel pursuant to this chapter. The 3 purpose of the fund is to provide dedicated revenues to support the operating costs 4 associated with the duties of the certification office. The commissioner may use this fund 5 for the efficient administration of the certification, authorization and approval of 6 educational personnel and for any other purpose determined necessary by the 7 commissioner to carry out the purposes of this chapter.

8 2. Fees. The commissioner shall assess fees for the administration and evaluation
 9 activities related to certification as follows:

10 A. An initial fee and a renewal fee for teacher, education specialist and administrator

11 certificates. The fees established by the commissioner apply for the initial 12 certification process for those teachers, education specialists and administrators found

13 eligible for certification and those found ineligible for certification;

- 14 <u>B. A renewal fee for each active and inactive administrator;</u>
- 15 C. A fee for each additional evaluation of teacher endorsements beyond the initial
 endorsement;
- 17 D. A fee for duplicate certificates; and
- 18 <u>E. A fee for evaluation of administrative portfolios.</u>

19 3. Dedicated revenues. All fees received pursuant to this chapter must be paid to 20 the Treasurer of State to be placed in a separate, dedicated account and credited to the 21 fund to be used solely by the department for carrying out the purposes of this chapter. 22 The fund may not lapse, but must be carried forward to carry out the purposes of this

23 <u>chapter.</u>

4. Budget development. On or before September 1st of even-numbered years, beginning September 1, 2008, the commissioner shall prepare estimates of the annual operating budget associated with the duties of the certification office for each fiscal year of the following biennium and shall establish a fee structure for the certification, authorization and approval of school personnel that is sufficient to provide an amount of dedicated revenues necessary to finance the operating budget associated with the duties of the certification office for each fiscal year of the following biennium.

31 Sec. 5. Adequacy of staffing; digital records. The estimated operating budget 32 developed by the Commissioner of Education for the certification office pursuant to the 33 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 13025 for the 2010-2011 biennium must also 34 include funding for the following initiatives.

It must include sufficient dedicated revenues to support the hiring of 2 additional
 Office Associate II positions in the certification office as compared to the staffing levels
 of Office Associate II positions in the certification office in fiscal year 2006-07.

38 2. It must include sufficient dedicated revenues to support the conversion of paper
 39 records and files within the certification office to digital records.

40 This section takes effect July 1, 2008.

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SUMMARY

21 This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Education 22 and Cultural Affairs. The amendment strikes and replaces the bill to establish an Other 23 Special Revenue Funds account to provide dedicated revenues for the certification office 24 within the Department of Education from the fees collected for the certification, 25 authorization and approval of educational personnel. The purpose of the fund is to 26 provide a sufficient amount of dedicated revenues to support the efficient administration 27 of the certification office within the Department of Education beginning in fiscal year 28 2009-10. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section to the bill.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This legislation results in a net cost to the General Fund of \$500,355 in fiscal year 2008-09.

The bill includes General Fund deappropriations totaling \$644,533 in fiscal year 2008-09 and corresponding Other Special Revenue Funds allocations to reflect the transfer of positions in the Certification Office within the Department of Education from the General Fund to the Certification, Authorization and Approval Fund established as a dedicated fund within the department. Of that amount, \$512,145 reflects the transfer of 6 existing positions including 1 Education Team Coordinator position, 2 Education Specialist III positions, 1 Office Assistant II position, 1 Office Associate II position and 1 Secretary position and related all other. The balance of \$132,388 reflects the transfer of the additional 2 Office Associate positions and related all other, including funds to provide the capability of electronic scanning and digital document management, that is included in the Governor's recommended budget for the 2008-2009 biennium to provide additional support to the Certification Office.

This bill also reflects the reduction in General Fund revenue from certification fees totaling \$1,144,888 in fiscal year 2008-09. Of this amount, \$1,032,500 reflects the amount currently included in the revenue projections developed by the Revenue Forecasting Committee. The balance of \$112,388 reflects additional revenue included in the Governor's recommended budget for the 2008-2009 biennium that is expected to be generated above what is reflected in the current revenue projections.

It is important to note that this fiscal note assumes that the proposals put forth in the Governor's recommended budget for the 2008-2009 biennium that are related to the Certification Office within the Department of Education are approved by the Legislature. If these proposals are not approved, this fiscal note will need to be amended.
