1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §2403, first ¶, as amended by PL 1983, c. 553, §38, is further
amended to read:

Applicants for a master or journeyman's oil burner technician or master solid fuel burner technician license shall present to the board a written application for examination, containing such information as the board may require, accompanied by the prescribed fee. Examinations shall <u>must</u> be in whole or in part in writing, shall <u>must</u> be conducted by the board and shall <u>must</u> be of a thorough and practical character commensurate with the responsibilities of the type of license applied for. The board shall provide at least one examination site per county and provide for an applicant to take an examination online.
