HOUSE AMENDMENT "H" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 383, L.D. 499, Bill, "An Act Making Unified Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, General Fund and Other Funds, and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 2008 and June 30, 2009"

Amend the amendment in Part XXXX in section 32 in §15696 in subsection 1 by striking out all of paragraph A (page 793, lines 27 and 28 in amendment) and inserting the following:

'A. The minimum state allocation under section 15689, subsection 1 for the school administrative unit is limited to that school administrative unit's special education costs as calculated pursuant to section 15681-A, subsection 2 multiplied by 55%.'

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment changes the language that proposes to eliminate the minimum state allocation for school administrative units that vote not to participate in a consolidation plan and instead reduces such a school administrative unit's minimum state allocation to 55% of that unit's approved special education costs.
