Beginning in school year 2008-2009, this per-pupil amount must be based on school year 2005-2006 system administration expenditures then reduced by 50% and inflated to an estimated allocation year level by a 10-year average increase in the Consumer Price Index or other reduced by 50% and inflated to an estimated allocation year level by a 10-year average increase in the Consumer Price Index.

13 Sec. XXXX-5. Stakeholder group. The Department of Education shall convene 14 a stakeholder group to study proposals and strategies to reduce costs and achieve savings, 15 including proposals to consolidate school administrative units. The stakeholder group 16 shall report by January 10, 2010 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having 17 jurisdiction over education and cultural affairs with its recommendations, including any 18 proposed implementing legislation. Following receipt and review of the report, the joint 19 standing committee may submit legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 124th 20 Legislature.'

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment retains the part of Committee Amendment "A" that makes decreases in essential programs and services funding. The amendment also requires the Department of Education to establish a stakeholder group to study proposals and strategies to reduce costs and achieve savings, including proposals to consolidate school administrative units and report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and cultural affairs by January 10, 2010.
