An Act To Remove the Sunset on the Exemption of Internet Services from Auctioneer Licensure Requirements

(EMERGENCY)

1 2	Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
3 4 5	Whereas, current law provides an exemption from auctioneering licensing requirements for a person who receives goods pursuant to a contract to sell those goods over the Internet; and
6	Whereas, the exemption is scheduled to terminate May 15, 2007; and
7 8 9	Whereas, that date will pass prior to the statutory adjournment date of the First Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature, which will create uncertainty as to the application of the auctioneering laws; and
10 11 12 13	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
14	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
15 16	Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §286, sub-§8, as enacted by PL 2005, c. 349, §1, is amended to read:
17 18 19	8. Contracted Internet services. This chapter does not apply to an individual who takes possession of goods pursuant to a contract for the exclusive purpose of selling those goods over the Internet, unless otherwise licensed under this chapter.
20	This subsection is repealed May 15, 2007.
21 22	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.
23	SUMMARY
24 25 26	Current law provides an exemption from licensing as an auctioneer for a person who contracts to sell goods over the Internet. The exemption is scheduled to expire on May 15, 2007.
27	This bill removes the sunset of the exemption.
