

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation replaces the resolve and changes the title to reflect the content of the amendment. The resolve directed the Department of Public Safety to study the effect of cellular telephone use on motor vehicle accidents. The amendment directs the department to analyze available data, including data generated from its planned upgrades of crash reports that will include fields for specific distractions and any other relevant data that may be available to the department, to determine the role various types of distractions play in motor vehicle accidents. It also directs the department to develop recommendations for strengthening laws relating to distracted driving. The department is directed to submit an interim report that includes recommended legislation to strengthen laws related to distracted driving to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters by January 15, 2009. The department is directed to provide a final report on the data it has collected and its analysis of that data together with any further recommended legislation related to distracted driving to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters by January 15, 2010. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters is authorized to submit legislation related to the department's report to the First and Second Regular Sessions of the 124th Legislature.
