### 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3474, sub-§2, ¶H, as amended by PL 2003, c. 653, §6, is
 further amended to read:

- 4 H. A relative by blood, marriage or adoption of an incapacitated or dependent adult
  5 named in a record; and

- Definitions. As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise indicates,
   the following terms have the following meanings.
- 24 A. "Animal" means every living, sentient creature not a human being.
- B. "Cruelty, abuse or neglect" means every act, omission or instance of neglect
   when unnecessary or unjustifiable pain or suffering is caused or permitted.
- 27 C. "Owner" means a person, firm, partnership, association or corporation owning,
   28 keeping or harboring an animal.
- D. "Reasonably suspect" means to hold an objectively reasonable suspicion based
   upon facts that would cause a reasonable person in a like position to draw on that
   person's training or experience to suspect animal cruelty, abuse or neglect.

32 2. Report. An employee of a state-funded child or adult protective services agency 33 or other social service agency, including those providing mental health services that are 34 funded or licensed by the department, while acting in the employee's professional 35 capacity or within the scope of the employee's employment, who has knowledge of or 36 observes an animal that the employee knows or reasonably suspects has been the victim 37 of cruelty, abuse or neglect may report the known or reasonably suspected animal cruelty, 1 abuse or neglect to the local animal control officer or to the animal welfare program of

the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources established pursuant to Title 7,
 section 3902.

4 3. Immediate response. When an immediate response is necessary to protect the
 5 health and safety of an animal, the report under subsection 2 must be made as soon as
 6 possible.

7 <u>4. Duty. Nothing in this section may be construed to impose a duty to investigate</u>
 8 known or reasonably suspected animal cruelty, abuse or neglect.

9 5. Immunity from liability. A person participating in good faith in reporting under 10 this subchapter is immune from any civil or criminal liability that might otherwise result 11 from these actions, including, but not limited to, any civil or criminal liability that might 12 otherwise arise under state or local laws or rules regarding confidentiality of information.

In a proceeding regarding immunity from liability, there is a rebuttable presumption of
 good faith.

#### SUMMARY

16 This bill gives those professionals who are already mandated reporters of adult or 17 child abuse, neglect or exploitation and social service agencies under contract with the Department of Health and Human Services the option of also disclosing such limited 18 19 confidential information related to a reasonable suspicion of animal cruelty, abuse or 20 neglect as would be needed by a local animal control officer or the animal welfare 21 program of the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to begin an 22 investigation. This bill extends the existing good faith immunity provision to the reporters of animal cruelty, abuse or neglect that are social service agencies under 23 24 contract with the Department of Health and Human Services. In addition, this bill permits employees of the Department of Health and Human Services to disclose the same 25 information to local animal control officers or to the animal welfare program of the 26 Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources. 27
