For any contract for public works entered into on or after July 1, 2009 and amounting to \$100,000 or more, except for a contract for paving or repaving roads and bridges and a contract for building new roads, the contract between the public authority and the successful bidder must contain a provision in which the successful bidder and all subcontractors of the successful bidder certify that each employee to be employed at the work site has successfully completed a course in construction safety approved by the United States Occupational Safety and Health Administration that is no shorter than 10 hours in duration. The successful bidder and all subcontractors of the successful bidder must provide to the public authority documentation of successful completion of the course required by this section by each employee with the first certified payroll report. In the case of a contract for paving or repaving roads and bridges or a contract for building new roads, preference must be given to a bidder that pledges to use employees to be employed at a work site who have successfully completed a course in construction safety approved by the United States Occupational Safety and Health Administration that is no shorter than 10 hours in duration.

The individuals described under this subsection are exempt from the requirement of subsection 1 that certain individuals complete a course in construction safety approved by the United States Occupational Safety and Health Administration that is no shorter than 10 hours in duration.
