**Resolve, To Establish a Commission To Study the Feasibility of the State's Acquiring the Golden Road**

Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

3 Whereas, the Commission to Study the Feasibility of the State's Acquiring the 4 Golden Road is established in this resolve to conduct a study and recommend reporting of 5 legislation to the next Legislature; and

6 Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that 7 the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the Second 8 Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature; and

9 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 10 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 11 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 12 therefore, be it

13 Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission To Study 14 the Feasibility of the State's Acquiring the Golden Road, referred to in this resolve as "the 15 commission," is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of
 8 members appointed as follows:

Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate, each of
 whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation;

20 2. Four members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the
21 House, each of whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation;

22 3. The Commissioner of Conservation or the commissioner's designee; and

4. One member who is a representative of the Department of Transportation,
appointed by the Commissioner of Transportation; and be it further

25 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate 26 chair of the commission and the first-named House of Representatives member is the 27 House chair of the commission; and be it further

**Sec. 4.** Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission, which must be no later than April 1, 2007; and be it further

34 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall gather information and 35 request necessary data from public and private entities in order to examine the feasibility 36 and possibility of acquiring for the State the private road known as "the Golden Road," a 37 road on private land, which goes from Millinocket to the Canadian border from the 1 private landowners. In conducting its study, the commission shall specifically work with 2 the landowners; and be it further

3 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative 4 Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services 5 to the commission; and be it further

6 Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the 7 commission are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine 8 Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary 9 expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Public members not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they 10 11 represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon a demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their 12 attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further 13

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than January 15, 2008, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature. The commission is authorized to introduce legislation related to its report to the Second Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature at the time of submission of its report; and be it further

20 Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited 21 extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the 22 Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

23 Sec. 10. Commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission's staff, shall administer the commission's budget. 24 Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and 25 proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The commission may not 26 27 incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council 28 shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on the 29 30 commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

31 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this 32 legislation takes effect when approved.
