Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §685-B, sub-§2, ¶B, as amended by PL 2005, c. 107, §1 and affected by §4, is further amended to read:
- The fee prescribed by the commission rules, that fee to be a minimum of \$50 but no greater than 1/4 of 1% of the total development costs, except that the fee for 5 subdivision applications is \$300 per lot. Zoning petitions submitted by other than a 6 state or federal agency range from \$50 to \$500 depending on size and complexity. 7 8 The fees apply to all amendments except for minor changes to building permits. In 9 addition to the fee paid in accordance with this paragraph, the director of the Maine 10 Land Use Regulation Commission may assess a processing fee on applications for extraordinary projects in accordance with section 685-F; 11

SUMMARY 12

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13 This bill amends the permit application fees set by rule by the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission to remove the limits regarding subdivision applications and 14 zoning petitions. 15
