7 Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §3089-A is enacted to read:

8 §3089-A. Acquired Brain Injury Fund

9 <u>There is established the Acquired Brain Injury Fund, an interest-bearing account,</u> 10 <u>referred to in this section as "the fund." The fund receives money appropriated or</u> 11 <u>allocated to the fund and any other money contributed voluntarily to the fund. The fund</u> 12 <u>is administered by the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention. All money</u> 13 <u>deposited in the fund and the earnings on that money remain in the fund and are subject</u> 14 <u>to the following requirements.</u>

15 <u>1. MaineCare waiver.</u> Up to 10% of the balance in the fund on July 1st each year
may be used to provide state matching funds for a MaineCare waiver program for persons
with brain injuries.

18 2. Acquired Brain Injury Advisory Council. The fund may be used to pay the
expenses of the Acquired Brain Injury Advisory Council established under section 3089 20 B.

3. Services; other purposes. The remainder of the fund, after expenditures
authorized under subsection 1, may be used to provide for vocational supportive services,
community reintegration services and supported living services. The fund may also be
used to support information and referral services, public and professional education and
the prevention of brain injuries.

26 <u>4. Administrative and personnel costs.</u> Money in the fund may be used for the
27 necessary administrative and personnel costs associated with the management of the fund.

28 <u>5. Limitation. Money in the fund may not be deposited in the General Fund or any</u>
29 <u>other fund except as specifically provided by law.</u>

30 Sec. 3. 22 MRSA §3089-B is enacted to read:

31 §3089-B. Acquired Brain Injury Advisory Council

32 <u>There is established the Acquired Brain Injury Advisory Council, referred to in this</u> 33 <u>section as "the council," to provide advice and make recommendations to the</u> 34 <u>commissioner, the Director of the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention and</u> 35 <u>the Director of the Office of MaineCare Services. The commissioner shall appoint 16</u> persons to serve as the members of the council. Members of the council must represent persons with acquired brain injuries, families of those persons and providers of services to persons with acquired brain injuries. Members of the council serve without compensation but are entitled to reimbursement of reasonable expenses for attending meetings of and serving on the council.

6 Sec. 4. Waiver application. By January 1, 2008, the Department of Health and 7 Human Services shall apply to the United States Department of Health and Human 8 Services, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services for a waiver under the MaineCare 9 program to provide a program of services and supports for persons with acquired brain 10 injuries.

11 Sec. 5. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.
