Revenue from the nonresident late season bear hunting permit under section 11151-A and the bear trapping permit under 12260-A must be deposited in the fund. The commissioner may accept and deposit into the fund monetary gifts, donations or other contributions from public or private sources for the purposes specified in this section. The fund must be held separate and apart from all other money, funds and accounts.

§11151-A. Nonresident late season bear hunting permit

- 2 1. Permit required. Except as otherwise authorized pursuant to this Part or for a nonresident who holds a valid bear hunting permit under section 11151, a nonresident may not hunt for bear during the regular firearm season on deer under section 11401
- 5 without a valid permit issued pursuant to this section.
- 6 Each day a person violates this subsection, that person commits a Class E crime for which
- 7 a minimum fine of \$50 and an amount equal to twice the applicable license fee must be
- 8 imposed.
- 2. Eligibility; nonresident late season bear hunting permit. A person who possesses a valid nonresident license to hunt big game may obtain a permit to hunt for bear from the commissioner or the commissioner's authorized agent.
- 3. Issuance; permit fee. The commissioner, through the commissioner's authorized agent, shall issue a nonresident late season bear hunting permit to an eligible person. The annual fee for each permit issued is \$40.

4 5 6 7	Sec. 8. Effective date. Those sections of this Act that enact the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, sections 10260, 11151-A and 12260-A and that amend section 11109, subsection 3, paragraph I and section 11109, subsection 3, paragraph L take effect January 1, 2008.'
8	SUMMARY
9	This amendment replaces the bill and does the following:
10 11	1. It establishes the Black Bear Research Fund to fund research regarding the management of black bear;
12 13 14	2. It requires nonresident hunters to obtain a nonresident late season bear hunting permit to hunt bear during the regular firearm season on deer if that person does not possess a regular season bear hunting permit. The fee for the permit is \$40;
15 16	3. It creates a new bear trapping permit. The fee for the permit is \$27 for residents and \$67 for nonresidents;
17	4. It prohibits the intentional waste of wounded or killed game animals;
18 19	5. It authorizes a guide to dispatch a client's wounded or killed bear, deer or moose after legal hunting hours; and
20 21	6. It provides an effective date of January 1, 2008 for those provisions regarding the Black Bear Research Fund and bear hunting and trapping.

Correctional and Judicial Impact Statements

Establishes new Class E crimes. Sentences for Class E crimes must be served in a county jail. The collection of additional fines may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

Changing certain aspects of allowable hunting activities and required licensure will have the net effect of increasing dedicated revenue collected by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife; the estimated increases are \$3,415 in fiscal year 2007-08 and \$34,150 in each fiscal year thereafter.
