1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §604 is enacted to read:
3	§604. Limits and compensation for on-call time
4 5	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
6 7	A. "Employer" means any private or public employer, including the State or any political subdivision of the State.
8 9	B. "On-call" means a standby status during which an employee is required to be available to work.
10 11 12	2. Limits for on-call time. An employer may not require an employee to be on-call unless such status was a condition of employment agreed to by the employee at the time of hire.
13 14 15	3. Compensation for on-call time. An employer shall pay an employee for all on-call time unless the employer and employee concur in a written contractual agreement that compensation is neither needed nor expected.
16	SUMMARY
17 18 19 20	This bill prohibits an employer from requiring an employee to be on-call unless on-call status was a condition of employment agreed to by the employee. The bill also requires an employer to pay an employee for all on-call time unless the employer and employee concur in a written contractual agreement that compensation is neither needed nor expected.
