15 This bill makes ongoing General Fund appropriations of \$4,000,000 per year
16 beginning in fiscal year 2007-08 to the University of Maine System to stabilize and
17 expand the Graduate School of Biomedical Science through the formation of a
18 partnership with the University of New England to collaborate on a school of pharmacy.
