11	Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:
12	'An Act To Establish the Missing Senior or Disabled Citizen Alert Program'
13	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and before the summary and
14	inserting the following:
15	'Mandate preamble. This measure requires one or more local units of government
16	to expand or modify activities so as to necessitate additional expenditures from local
17	revenues but does not provide funding for at least 90% of those expenditures. Pursuant to
18 19	the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 21, 2/3 of all of the members elected to each House have determined it necessary to enact this measure.
20	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
21	Sec. 1. 25 MRSA c. 259 is enacted to read:
22	<u>CHAPTER 259</u>
23	MISSING SENIOR OR DISABLED CITIZEN ALERT PROGRAM
24	§2201. Short title
25 26	This chapter may be known and cited as "the Missing Senior or Disabled Citizen Alert Program."
27	§2202. Definitions
28 29	As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 587, L.D. 769

- 1 1. Clearinghouse. "Clearinghouse" means the Missing Senior or Disabled Citizen 2 Clearinghouse as established under section 2204. 3
 - 2. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Public Safety.
 - 3. Department. "Department" means the Department of Public Safety.
- 5 Disabled. "Disabled" means having a physical or mental impairment that 6 substantially limits one or more major life activities.
- 7 5. Health care provider. "Health care provider" means an individual licensed, 8 certified or otherwise authorized or permitted by law to provide health care in the 9 ordinary course of business or practice of a profession.
- 10 6. Missing senior or disabled citizen. "Missing senior or disabled citizen" means a person who is 60 years of age or older and who has an impaired mental condition or a 11 12 person who is disabled and has an impaired mental condition and:
 - A. Whose temporary or permanent residence is in or is believed to be in this State;
- B. Whose location is not determined; and 14
- 15 C. Whose disappearance poses a credible threat to the safety and health of the person as determined by a local law enforcement agency. 16

§2203. Missing senior or disabled citizen report

- 18 1. Report. A family member, legal guardian, agent under a health care power of 19 attorney or health care provider of a missing senior or disabled citizen may submit a good 20 faith report that includes information about the missing person's impaired mental 21 condition to a local law enforcement agency.
- 22 2. Filing of report. On the filing of a report under subsection 1 by a missing senior or disabled citizen's family member, legal guardian, agent under a health care power of 23 24 attorney or health care provider, the law enforcement agency receiving written 25 notification shall, using standard operating procedures, immediately:
- 26 A. Notify the department;
- 27 B. Inform all on-duty law enforcement officers in the county where the senior or disabled citizen was reported missing of the missing person; 28
- 29 Communicate the report to every other law enforcement agency having 30 jurisdiction in the county in which the report was filed;
- 31 D. Enter the report under subsection 1 for inclusion in the computer files on missing 32 senior or disabled citizens of the department and the National Crime Information
- 33 Center or its successor; and
- 34 E. Submit information in the missing persons report to the clearinghouse.
- 35 3. Alert. When the local law enforcement agency has verified that a senior or disabled citizen is missing, the agency shall issue an alert. 36
- 37 A. The alert must be sent to designated media outlets in the State, participating radio 38 stations and television stations, who may issue the alert at designated intervals.

- B. The alert must include all appropriate information from the local law enforcement agency that may assist in the safe recovery of a missing senior or disabled citizen.
- The alert must include a statement instructing anyone with information related to the
- 4 missing senior or disabled citizen to contact that person's local law enforcement
- 5 agency.
- 6 C. The alert is cancelled when the local law enforcement agency has found the
- 7 missing senior or disabled citizen or the department has been notified that the missing
- 8 senior or disabled citizen has been found.
- 9 D. A law enforcement agency that locates a missing senior or disabled citizen who is
- the subject of an alert shall notify the local law enforcement agency and the
- department as soon as possible that the missing senior or disabled citizen has been
- found.

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§2204. Missing Senior or Disabled Citizen Clearinghouse

- 14 1. Establishment; purpose. The Missing Senior or Disabled Citizen Clearinghouse
 15 is established within the department as a central repository of information regarding
 16 missing senior or disabled citizens. The clearinghouse must:
- A. Facilitate the use of standard processes for intrastate communication of information for the purpose of disseminating information related to missing senior or
- disabled citizens who are determined missing by their families, legal guardians,
- agents under a health care power of attorney, health care providers or a law
- 21 enforcement agency;
- B. Provide a centralized file for the exchange of information on missing senior or
- 23 disabled citizens in the State;
- C. Interface with the National Crime Information Center, or its successor, for the
- 25 exchange of information; and
- D. Collect, process, maintain and disseminate information on missing senior or
- 27 disabled citizens and strive to maintain or disseminate accurate and complete
- 28 information.
- 29 2. Receipt of reports. A law enforcement agency shall submit to the clearinghouse
- information received by the law enforcement agency pursuant to section 2203. A family
- 31 member, legal guardian, agent under a health care power of attorney or health care
- 32 provider may submit a missing senior or disabled citizen report to the clearinghouse
- 33 regardless of the circumstances, subsequent to reporting the senior or disabled citizen
- 34 missing to the appropriate law enforcement agency in the county in which the senior or
- 35 disabled citizen became missing. The report must be included in the clearinghouse
- 36 database.

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§2205. Location of senior or disabled citizen

- 38 1. Notification. The family member, legal guardian, agent under a health care
- 39 power of attorney or health care provider who is responsible for notifying the
- 40 clearinghouse or a law enforcement agency about a missing senior or disabled citizen
- 41 shall immediately notify the clearinghouse or the agency of a senior or disabled citizen
- 42 whose location has been determined.

1	2. Purging. Information received about a missing senior or disabled citizen pursuant
2	to section 2203 that has been included in the clearinghouse database must be purged from
3	the database immediately upon notification that the senior or disabled citizen's location
4	has been determined.
5	§2206. Rules
6	The commissioner shall adopt rules for the implementation of this chapter. Rules
7	adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter
8	375, subchapter 2-A.'
9	SUMMARY
10	This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal
11	Justice and Public Safety and replaces the bill. The amendment expands the missing
12	senior citizens alert program created in the bill to include persons with disabilities who
13	have impaired mental conditions. The amendment maintains all the features of the
14	program as created in the bill, except that the clearinghouse director position is eliminated
15	and the list of persons who may submit a missing persons report under the program is
16	expanded to include the missing person's agent under a health care power of attorney and
17	the person's health care provider.
18	The amendment also adds a mandate preamble.
