1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. Strengthen rural development. Maine Rural Partners, a nonprofit 3 organization that is Maine's federally recognized state rural development council, shall:

Complete pilot projects underway in the Town of Strong and Washington County
to build innovative strategic plans and to create community investment mechanisms;

6 2. Prepare an analysis of the potential for attracting and leveraging investment in 7 rural Maine communities; and

8 3. Make recommendations to the Legislature and Governor regarding methods of 9 encouraging such investment.

SUMMARY

23 This bill requires Maine Rural Partners to:

1. Complete pilot projects underway in the Town of Strong and Washington County
to build innovative strategic plans and to create community investment mechanisms;

26 2. Prepare an analysis of the potential for attracting and leveraging investment in 27 rural Maine communities; and

3. Make recommendations to the Legislature and Governor regarding methods ofencouraging such investment.
