26 **SUMMARY**

> This amendment replaces the bill and requires the Department of Health and Human Services to convene, in coordination with the Maine Primary Care Association, a work group that will review existing efforts in Maine and projects in other states concerning education and screening for postpartum depression. The bill specifies projects that must be included in the review and requires the work group to report findings and recommendations including legislation by January 15, 2008. The bill authorizes the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services to submit legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature.
