1 **Sec. 1. Coyote control program. Resolved:** That the Commissioner of Inland
2 Fisheries and Wildlife shall review the existing coyote control program. In reviewing the
3 program, the commissioner shall establish methods of controlling the coyote population
4 and set goals to manage the coyote population; and be it further

5 **Sec. 2. Report. Resolved:** That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and
6 Wildlife shall report the commissioner's findings and recommendations under section 1
7 to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife by December 30, 2007.
8 The Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife may submit legislation
9 related to the report to the Second Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature.

SUMMARY

11 This resolve directs the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to review the
12 existing coyote control program. The commissioner shall report the commissioner's
13 findings and recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and
14 Wildlife by December 30, 2007. The Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and
15 Wildlife may submit legislature to the Second Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature.
