20 21 22 23	This amendment retains the provisions of the bill that allow a self-pay patient to purchase prescribed brand-name drugs even if the prescriber has not indicated that the prescription is for brand-name only. The amendment excludes from this provision drugs that are listed as Schedule II drugs on the federal drug schedule.
