Resolve, To Establish a Commission To Study the Possibility of Implementing the Proposed Healthy Americans Act

(EMERGENCY)

1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

3 Whereas, the Commission to Study the Possibility of Implementing the Healthy 4 Americans Act is established in this resolve to conduct a study and recommend 5 legislation to be submitted to the Second Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature; and

6 Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that 7 the study may be completed and a report prepared in time for submission to the Second 8 Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature; and

9 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 10 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 11 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 12 therefore, be it

13 Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the 14 Possibility of Implementing the Healthy Americans Act, referred to in this resolve as "the 15 commission," is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of
8 members appointed as follows:

18 1. Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate, each of
19 whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services;

Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the
House of Representatives, each of whom serves on the Joint Standing Committee on
Health and Human Services;

23 3. One representative of a health insurance organization, appointed by the Governor;

4. One representative of a business organization, appointed by the Governor;

25 5. One representative of a labor organization, appointed by the Governor;

6. One representative of the Maine Municipal Association, appointed by theGovernor; and be it further

28 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate
29 chair of the commission and the first-named House of Representatives member is the
30 House chair of the commission; and be it further

Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission, which may be no later than 60 days following the effective date of this resolve; and be it
further

Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall gather information and request necessary data from public and private entities in order to thoroughly review the Healthy Americans Act proposed by Senator Ron Wyden of Oregon and to study the possibility of this act's being enacted in this State. This proposed act establishes a centrally financed system of private health insurance for all those people not covered by Medicare System; and be it further

9 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall provide 10 necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further

11 Sec. 7. Compensation. **Resolved:** That the legislative members of the 12 commission are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary 13 expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Public 14 members not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they 15 16 represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon a 17 demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their 18 attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further

19 Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than January 15, 2008, the commission 20 shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested 21 legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature. The 22 commission is authorized to introduce legislation related to its report to the Second 23 Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature at the time of submission of its report; and be it 24 further

25 Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited 26 extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the 27 Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

28 Sec. 10. Commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, 29 with assistance from the commission's staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and 30 31 proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The commission may not 32 incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. 33 Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council 34 shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on the 35 commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

36 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this 37 legislation takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

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This resolve establishes the Commission to Study the Possibility of Implementing the Healthy Americans Act proposed by Senator Ron Wyden of Oregon, which would establish a centrally financed system of private health insurance for those not covered by Medicare.

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
