An Act Concerning the Diagnosis, Service and Repair of Motor Vehicles

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- 2 Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §1174, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:
- 3 2-A. Service information. Manufacturer to fail to promptly provide to the motor 4 vehicle owner or lessee and any motor vehicle repair facility the information necessary to 5 diagnose, service or repair a motor vehicle manufactured by that manufacturer. Except as 6 provided in this subsection, service information includes information necessary to 7 integrate replacement equipment into the vehicle and other information to diagnose, service or repair, activate, certify or install motor vehicle equipment in a motor vehicle. 8 9 Service information does not include information that is a trade secret as defined in 10 section 1542, subsection 4.
- A. Notwithstanding section 1186, a person who violates this subsection commits a civil violation for which a fine of not more than \$10,000 may be adjudged for the first offense and not more than \$20,000 may be adjudged for each subsequent violation.
- B. A motor vehicle owner or the owner of a motor vehicle repair facility may bring a civil action to enjoin a violation of this subsection and to recover litigation costs, including but not limited to reasonable attorney's fees and expert witness fees;

- Any Notwithstanding section 1174, subsection 2-A, a person who shall violate
  violates any provisions of this chapter shall be is subject to the jurisdiction of the courts
  of this State, upon service of process in accordance with Title 14, chapter 203, and
  consistent with the maximum limits of due process as decided by the United States
  Supreme Court.

- This bill requires an automobile manufacturer to provide the owner or lessee and repair facilities with the information necessary to diagnose, service or repair, certify, activate or install equipment in a motor vehicle it has manufactured.
