Amend the bill in section 2 in §4421 by striking out all of the first paragraph and inserting in its place the following:

'The Maine Port Authority consists of a board of directors, referred to in this section as "the board." The board consists of 7 directors who must be broadly representative of the State and must have a background in international trade, marine transportation, finance or economic development. Five directors are appointed by the Governor, each to serve for 4 years. The Commissioner of Transportation serves as an ex officio member of the board and as chair of the board and president. The president of the Maine International Trade Center serves as an ex officio member of the board. The directors shall elect a vice-chair, treasurer and other officers as the board determines necessary. A vacancy must be filled for an unexpired term by the Governor.'

Amend the bill in section 2 in §4421 in subsection 1 in the 4th line (page 1, line 19 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "Each director" the following: ', other than those who serve ex officio,'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

19 SUMMARY

This amendment makes the following changes to the bill.

- 1. The bill provides for the appointment of 6 directors to the Maine Port Authority by the Governor. The amendment reduces this to 5 appointments so that the total number of directors, including the Commissioner of Transportation and the president of the Maine International Trade Center, is 7 members.
- 2. The amendment changes a reference in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12004-F, subsection 8 to the compensation of the directors of the Maine Port Authority to make it consistent with the change to compensation made by the bill. The amendment also clarifies that the Commissioner of Transportation and the president of the Maine International Trade Center are not entitled to this compensation.
- 3. The bill provides that employees of the Maine Port Authority are subject to the state retirement system. The amendment adds these employees to the definition of "state employee" in the retirement system laws to clarify that they are included under the retirement system.

#### **Fiscal Note**

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

Including employees of the Maine Port Authority in the state employee health insurance program will result in increased costs to the authority to cover the employer costs of participating in the program; the amounts will depend on the number of persons employed by the authority at any one time and can not be determined at this time. In addition, increasing the number of members of the authority's board of directors will increase authority expenses by relatively minor amounts.

Because this legislation requires the Maine Port Authority, as an independent agency, to make the employer contributions for their employees to the Maine State Retirement System, there is no fiscal impact to the System.

Additional costs to the Maine International Trade Center associated with serving on the Maine Port Authority's board of directors can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
