An Act To Reimburse MaineCare in Certain Workers' Compensation Cases

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 39-A MRSA §209, sub-§4 is enacted to read:

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<u>4. MaineCare reimbursement.</u> MaineCare must be paid 100% of any expenses
incurred for the treatment of an injury of an employee under this Title.

5 Sec. 2. 39-A MRSA §324, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 885, Pt. A, §8 and 6 affected by §§9 to 11, is amended to read:

7 1. Order or decision. The employer or insurance carrier shall make compensation 8 payments within 10 days after the receipt of notice of an approved agreement for payment 9 of compensation or within 10 days after any order or decision of the board awarding compensation. If the board enters a decision awarding compensation and an appeal is 10 filed with the Law Court pursuant to section 322, payments may not be suspended while 11 12 the appeal is pending. The employer or insurer may recover from an employee payments made pending appeal to the Law Court if and to the extent that the Law Court has decided 13 14 that the employee was not entitled to the compensation paid. The board has full 15 jurisdiction to determine the amount of overpayment, if any, and the amount and schedule 16 of repayment, if any. The board, in determining whether or not repayment should be made and the extent and schedule of repayment, shall consider the financial situation of 17 the employee and the employee's family and may not order repayment that would work 18 19 hardship or injustice. The board shall notify the Commissioner of Health and Human Services within 10 days after the receipt of notice of an approved agreement for payment 20 21 of compensation or within 10 days after any order or decision of the board awarding 22 compensation identifying the employee who is to receive the compensation.

SUMMARY

This bill requires MaineCare expenses incurred for the treatment of an injury of an employee covered by workers' compensation to be reimbursed 100% and requires the Workers' Compensation Board to notify the Commissioner of Health and Human Services within 10 days after the receipt of notice of an approved agreement for payment of compensation or within 10 days after any order or decision of the board awarding compensation identifying the employee who is to receive the compensation.
