1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §1125, sub-§5-A is enacted to read:
3 4 5 6	5-A. Minimum number of votes in primary election required. In order to continue to be a certified candidate for State Senator or State Representative, such a certified candidate who participates in a primary election must receive at least 25 votes in that primary election.

8 9 10	This bill provides that in order to continue to be a certified candidate for State Senator or State Representative under the Maine Clean Election Act, such a certified candidate who participates in a primary election must receive at least 25 votes in that primary election.
