1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §1107-A, sub-§5 is enacted to read:
3 4 5 6	5. A person may not be charged with unlawful possession of a scheduled drug or controlled substance under subsection 1, paragraphs C to F until that person is given 24 hours to produce a valid prescription for the scheduled drug or controlled substance that is the basis for the charge.
7	SUMMARY
8 9 10	This bill requires that a person be given 24 hours to produce a valid prescription for a scheduled drug or controlled substance before being charged with unlawful possession of that scheduled drug or controlled substance.
