16 17 18 19	This bill includes children's services caseworkers, supervisors and program administrators working in the Department of Health and Human Services on or hired by the department after July 1, 2007 in the 1998 Special Plan under the Maine State Retirement System. The plan's option to retire at age 55 recognizes the daily dangerous and stressful situations these staff face in their positions.
