COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 496, L.D. 1418, Bill, "An Act To Provide Patients with Their Medication"

Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 1 and 2.

Amend the bill in section 3 in paragraph E in the first line (page 1, line 9 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "2 1/2" and inserting the following: '~~2 1/2~~ 3 1/2'

Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 4 to 14.

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report of the committee. It changes the definition of "usable amount of marijuana for medical use" from 2 1/2 ounces or less to 3 1/2 ounces or less and strikes all other provisions of the bill.
