Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §2700-A, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:
- 2-A. Software advertising. Software that assists a health care practitioner in
 prescribing a drug may not influence or attempt to influence or permit a person to
 influence or attempt to influence a prescribing decision of the health care practitioner,
- 6 including the drug that is prescribed or the pharmacy to fill the prescription, by any
- 7 means, including, but not limited to, advertising, instant messaging and pop-up
- 8 advertisements. For purposes of this subsection, "software" has the same meaning as in
- 9 Title 11, section 9-1102, subsection 75.

10 SUMMARY

This bill prohibits computer software that assists a health care practitioner in prescribing drugs from influencing the prescribing decision of the health care practitioner through any means, including, but not limited to, advertising, instant messaging and pop-
