## 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §1916, sub-§1, ¶C, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 3 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read: 4 A side window or rear window is composed of, covered by or treated with a material that has allows a light transmittance of less than 50% 35% net of glass and 5 6 material; or 7 Sec. 2. 29-A MRSA §1916, sub-§2, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 8 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read: 9 A. The provisions of subsection 1 do not apply to: 10 (1) A certificate or other paper required or allowed by law to be displayed, which 11 must be removable; 12 (2) The label attached to a window showing the price, estimated mileage and 13 other federally mandated information commonly known as the manufacturer's 14 suggested retail price label, which must be removable; 15 (3) Sun-screening or window-tinting material along a 4-inch strip at the AS-1 16 line. For the purposes of this paragraph, "AS-1 line" means a parallel line 5 17 inches from the top of the windshield; or 18 (4) Motor vehicles for which the Chief of the State Police has granted an 19 exception because the health of the owner or a person who usually occupies the 20 vehicle is adversely affected by sunlight. The Chief of the State Police may, upon proper application, provide the owner of a motor vehicle with a certificate 21 of exemption that must be displayed upon the request of a law enforcement 22 23 officer. **SUMMARY** 24 This bill amends the law concerning automotive reflective and tinted glass by 25 lowering the minimum standards for the percentage of light that must be transmitted 26 27

through a side window or a rear window from 50% to 35% net of glass and material. The bill expands by 1 inch the sun-screening or tinting material allowed at the top of a

29 windshield.
