At a minimum, the public education program developed by the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention must include the distribution of written materials to elementary and secondary schools and health care providers throughout the State. The Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention shall also expand and update the information and resources made available on its publicly accessible website regarding Lyme disease and other tick-borne illnesses; and be it further

Resolved: That upon the approval of the Legislative Council, the Joint Standing Committee on Insurance and Financial Services shall review issues regarding Lyme disease and other tick-borne illnesses, including, but not limited to, the difficulties associated with diagnosis, the differences between treatment protocols recommended for treatment and the manner in which insurance coverage is provided. In conducting its review, the committee shall invite the participation of interested parties and gather public input as necessary. The committee may submit legislation related to its review to the Second

Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature.'

This amendment replaces the bill, and changes it to a resolve. The amendment directs the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention to undertake public education efforts relating to the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of Lyme disease and other tick-borne illnesses. The amendment also requires the Joint Standing Committee on Insurance and Financial Services to review issues related to Lyme disease and other tick-borne illnesses and authorizes the committee to submit legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature.
