An Act To Increase Judicial Salaries

(EMERGENCY)

Reported by President EDMONDS of Cumberland for the Judicial Compensation Commission pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 4, section 1701.

1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, current salaries for members of Maine's judiciary are among the lowest in
both the New England states and the nation as a whole; and

5 Whereas, The annual cost-of-living increases for judicial salaries required by 6 current law have not been implemented on a regular basis, thereby causing current 7 judicial salaries to lag behind intended salary levels recommended by the Judicial 8 Compensation Commission in previous reports to the Legislature dating back to 1996; 9 and

10 Whereas, it is the recommendation of the Judicial Compensation Commission that 11 increases in judicial salaries become effective July 1, 2007; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

16 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Chief justice; salary. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court is entitled
 to receive a salary, for fiscal year 1998-99 2007-08 and thereafter, of \$111,000 \$153,588,
 to be paid biweekly.

Sec. 2. 4 MRSA §4, sub-§2, ¶A, as repealed and replaced by PL 1997, c. 643, Pt.
 M, §2, is amended to read:

A. For fiscal year 1998-99 <u>2007-08</u> and thereafter, \$96,000 <u>\$133,555</u>, to be paid biweekly.

Sec. 3. 4 MRSA §102, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1997, c. 643, Pt. M, §4, is
further amended to read:

Chief justice; salary. The Chief Justice of the Superior Court is entitled to
 receive a salary, for fiscal year 1998 99 2007-08 and thereafter, of \$94,000 \$130,884, to
 be paid biweekly.

 32 Pt. M, §5, is amended to read:

A. For fiscal year 1998-99 2007-08 and thereafter, \$90,000 \$125,542, to be paid

Chief Judge; salary. The Chief Judge of the District Court is entitled to receive a

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this
 legislation takes effect when approved.

This bill, submitted by the Judicial Compensation Commission as part of its 2007 report to the Legislature, increases judicial salaries to levels that would have been achieved if the recommendations made in the commission's 1996 report had been fully implemented.
