## 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §1052, sub-§5, ¶A, as amended by PL 2005, c. 575, §5, is
 further amended to read:

(1) Any separate or segregated fund established by any corporation, membership organization, cooperative or, labor organization or nonprofit entity whose purpose is to influence the outcome of an election, including a candidate or question;

9 (2) Any person who serves as a funding and transfer mechanism and spends 10 money to initiate, advance, promote, defeat or influence in any way a candidate, 11 campaign, political party, referendum or initiated petition in this State;

12 (3) Any organization, including any corporation or association or nonprofit 13 entity, that has as its major purpose advocating the passage or defeat of a ballot 14 question and that makes expenditures other than by contribution to a political 15 action committee, for the purpose of the initiation, promotion or defeat of any 16 question; and

(4) Any organization, including any corporation or <u>nonprofit</u>
<u>entity</u>, that has as its major purpose advocating the passage or defeat of a ballot
question and that solicits funds from members or nonmembers and spends more
than \$1,500 in a calendar year to initiate, advance, promote, defeat or influence in
any way a candidate, campaign, political party, referendum or initiated petition,
including the collection of signatures for a direct initiative, in this State; and

23 Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §1053, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, §6, is 24 amended to read:

4. Form of organization. The form or structure of organization, including
 cooperatives, corporations, voluntary associations, partnerships, nonprofit entities or any
 other structure by which the committee functions. The date of origin or incorporation
 must also be specified;

SUMMARY

This bill includes nonprofit entities in the laws governing required reporting by political action committees.
