An Act To Protect School Athletic Contest Officials

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §207, sub-§4 is enacted to read:

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3 4. Notwithstanding subsection 3, an assault against a school athletic contest official 4 that occurs within the confines or immediate vicinity of an athletic facility at which the 5 school athletic contest official is acting or was acting in that person's capacity of a school athletic contest official is a Class C crime punishable by a fine of up to \$10,000 and 6 imprisonment of not more than 3 years. For purposes of this subsection, "school athletic 7 contest official" means a person acting in the capacity of an umpire, referee, judge, 8 9 timekeeper, coach, instructor, administrator or other position, including an assistant to any such person, while that person is actively engaged in the officiating, conducting or 10 supervising of a public or private school contest. "School athletic contest official" does 11 not include a person participating in the sport as a team member or contestant. 12

SUMMARY

This bill makes assault against a school athletic contest official, including an umpire, coach or administrator, a Class C crime punishable by a fine of up to \$10,000 and imprisonment of not more than 3 years.
