15 This bill makes a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$250,000 in fiscal year  
16 2007-08 for Youth Alternatives' family-focused services initiative to provide funds to  
17 complete the requirements of a private challenge grant for providing secure space at the  
18 former Maine Youth Center.
