12 The provisions of this subchapter do not apply to a municipality that has adopted economic and community impact review criteria that apply to large-scale retail 13 14 development land use permit applications and that require a study of the comprehensive 15 economic and community impacts of the proposed large-scale retail development for consideration, among other evidence, in applying the review criteria to the application.' 16

SUMMARY

18 This amendment provides an exemption from the Informed Growth Act, which is 19 enacted in the bill, for a municipality that has adopted economic and community impact 20 review criteria that apply to large-scale retail development land use permit applications 21 and that require a study of the comprehensive economic and community impacts of the 22 proposed large-scale retail development for consideration, among other evidence, in 23 applying the review criteria to the application.

Providing an exemption from certain Informed Growth Act provisions for some municipalities may reduce the number of times the State Planning Office will be involved in the permitting process proposed in the bill. This change will result in minor savings to the State Planning Office. As amended, the bill is still a funded mandate to other municipalities.
